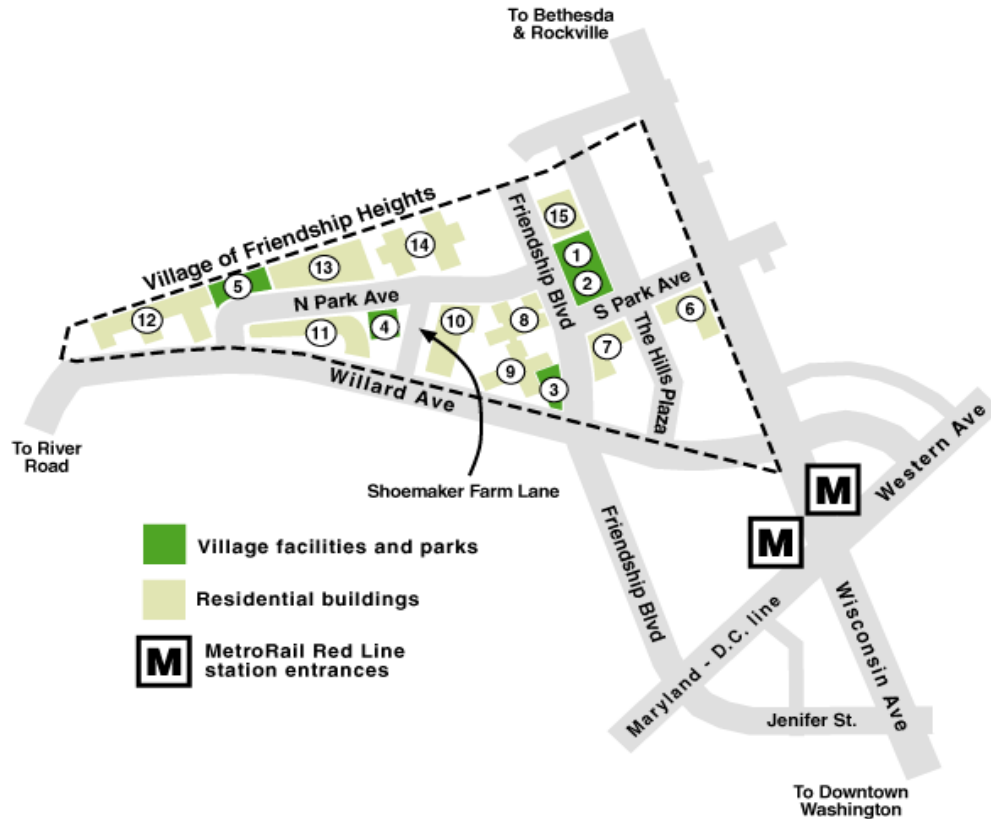


Theodore Sorensen served as special counsel and adviser to President John F. Kennedy, and was one of the president's most prominent and prolific speechwriters. He practiced international law for over thirty-six years as a senior partner at the law firm of Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison LLP, where he is now of counsel. He is a widely published author on the presidency and foreign affairs, and his works include *Decision Making in the White House*, *Kennedy*, *The Kennedy Legacy*, and *Why I Am a Democrat*. His most recent work is *Counselor: A Life at the Edge of History*, which provides unique insight into his time in the Kennedy White House.
